

Requirements for becoming an election inspector (poll workers).

Poll workers, according to law, officiate at every election for a two-year term. Their tasks include opening polls, officiating at elections, tabulate votes, and closing polls.

- ◇ Must be over 18.
- ◇ Individuals should be able to hear, read and write and understand election proceedings.
- ◇ Poll workers must be physically able to perform their duties.
- ◇ Be able to work all day (13 + hours). Split shifts are offered upon request.
- ◇ Keep one to four days per year open, in case they are called upon to work.
- ◇ Their political philosophy and willingness to join the Party are also important.
- ◇ Need to take an oath of office.
- ◇ Be willing to attend training sessions to learn the laws and procedures for conducting fair and impartial elections.
- ◇ Poll workers are paid for their work by the municipality.

Retirees are encourage to apply.
